








A Ríverside Greenway would bridge four major roadways and cross the river three times to link Auburndale to Wellesley























1893 Charles Eliot Open Space Plan: Riverside was a major destination








On warm weekends up to 5000 canoes would be launched onto the river and paddled up stream towards Lower Falls or down stream to the lakes district. Shore side attractions, including the largest swimming pool in New England, drew a tremendous diversity of visitors. The advent of the automobile, the construction of highways, the game of golf replaced this by the mid 20th century.



Carriage Road Split - Greenway option A






