


BASIC FACTS










































BASIC GOALS

- Ensure through pedestrian movement.
- Preserve and enhance opportunities for passive recreation and fishing.
- Improve how stormwater moves through and is collected on site.
- Create a landscape that is stable and sustainable.
- Enhance and protect views.
- Improve water quality.
- Ensure accessibility across the site.





WHAT WE HEARD

- Limit vertical elements.
- Keep it simple; keep it natural.
- Preserve the flow from Lake Avenue to the Crystal Lake edge.
- Improve accessibility.
- Cantilevered overlook deck expands access and use of the park.
- Height of plantings along the road edge should allow for visibility across the park, but also direct pedestrian traffic along pathways.
- Pedestrian traffic funnels from Lakewood Ave.
- Add terraced walls in the landscape to mitigate erosion issues.

• Make the secondary pathway more direct.




EXISTING CONDITIONS PLAN








PROPOSED OVERLOOK DECK: 500 sf

EXISTING SHORELINE ACCESS AREA








PROPOSED SHORELINE ACCESS AREA








PROPOSED SHORELINE ACCESS AREA: +/- 300 sf




PREFERRED PLAN – SECTION B










PREFERRED PLAN: RAIN GARDEN / INFILTRATION AREA
